

Arthur the Farmer

A Positive Encouraging Book on Spreading Love and Kindness

Arthur the Farmer wants to spread his love and to bring joy to people to make his world a better place.

Metaphors are used to help explain an idea or make a comparison. Example: Planting seeds can mean many things.

Arthur teaches us that our actions can hurt others. Arthur's positive message is about setting a good example and how we should treat others with kindness and forgiveness.

Book Topics

- The meaning of Planting Seeds
- Showing Love and Kindness
- Apologizing for Your Actions When You Hurt Someone's Feelings
- Saying I am sorry
- Forgiving Others
- Being Kind

Ideas for how to review this book with kids 3-6:

- What was the message of the story? Have the child retell the story in their own words.
- Go back to each page and have the child describe what is going on.
- Questions:
 - What is Arthur's Job?
 - How does a Arthur help people?
 - What are the characters feeling during each scene?
 - What lesson does the supporting character learn?
 - What can you do to set an example?

Tips on Topics and Discussions for Advanced Readers: Kids 7-8:

- In this story the Author uses words that is used to describe something else. Discuss what a figure of speech and a metaphor is.
- **Questions**:
 - What does the author mean by "planting good seeds"?
 - What do the seeds represent?
 - What could the vegetables and flowers represent?
 - What kind of world is Arthur trying to create?
 - What kind of world do you want to live in?

Compare Books

Try comparing the story Arthur The Farmer with other Sculptlings Books, such as Sam The Policeman and compare the 2 messages.

• Try comparing the characters and their lessons. How are they different? How are they the same? Example: (Both are setting a good example, being a good role model and helping people in their profession.)
