

Compare Books

Try comparing the story Brad the Graduate with other Sculptlings Books, such as Lee the Ukulele Player and compare the 2 messages.

Try comparing the characters and their lessons. How are they different? How are they the same?
Example: Both Characters teach others how to succeed. There are distractions in both stories while others are trying to learn and behave.
