- What lesson does Roger's Team learn about working together?
- What type of consequences happen in the story because the chickens are not getting along?
- What can you accomplish if you had a team working together to help you?

#### **Compare Books**

Try comparing the story Roger the Construction Worker with other Sculptlings Books, such as Byron the Fireman and compare the 2 messages.

 Try comparing the characters and their lessons. How are they different? How are they the same? (Example: Both characters are in charge. Both professions work together to get the job done.)
