### What To Do Incase of a Fire

- Retell the story in your own words.
- Go back to each page and describe what is going on. (Let the child share what they remember. It helps with comprehension and expression.)
- What would you do if something caught on fire?
- Rhyme Time: Find rhyming words together. "Did you hear any words that sound the same?"

### More Ideas for how to use these books with your Kindergarteners to 2<sup>nd</sup> Graders.

- What does a firefighter do?
- What does Byron say to do if you see smoke coming from under a door?
- What do you do if there's a fire at your house?
- What are the safety measures in your home for fire emergencies?
- How can you help people if there's a fire?

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# Questions and Answers for Fire Safety Discussion

## Questions from Byron the Fireman's Story

### Kindergarten to 2nd grade

#### Fire Safety Discussion Answers

**1. Why is it important to know where the exits are in your home or school?**

A: If there is a fire, you know how to get out quickly and safely.

**2. What should you do if you see smoke under a door?**

A: Don't open the door. Get low to the ground, crawl away, and find another way out.

**3. Why do firefighters say to "stay low" during a fire?**

A: Because smoke rises, and it's easier to breathe and see when you stay close to the floor.

**4. What should you yell if you are stuck and need help during a fire?**

A: "Fire! Fire! Help me!" Yelling loud helps people know where you are.

**5. Who can be a hero during a fire?**

A: You can! If you stay calm, follow safety steps, and get help, you're being very brave.

**6. Why is it important to practice fire drills at home or school?**

A: So you won't be scared if a real fire happens—you'll know exactly what to do.
