



Sam the Policeman is a story about a kind and caring police officer named Sam who works hard to keep everyone safe, day and night. He helps people when they are lost, solves mysteries, and reminds others to follow the rules. Through Sam's actions, children learn important lessons about kindness, honesty, and helping others. The story teaches that when we make good choices, tell the truth, and lend a hand, we help make the world a better and safer place. Sam shows us that being good and doing good helps our light shine bright for everyone to see!

Ideas for how to review this book with Preschool kids: Engage little learners with simple, interactive questions and activities:

- What was the message of the story?
- Retell the story in your own words.
- Go back to each page and describe what is going on. (Let the child share what they remember. It helps with comprehension and expression.)
- Who is Sam? What is his job? And why he likes his profession. (Sam is a police officer. *His job is to keep people safe and help them when they need help. He wants to help others.*)
- Discuss each interaction that Sam has in the story. (*When a child got lost, when chickens fight, and accidents happen. Discuss Sams role and how he helps them.*)
- Rhyme Time: Find rhyming words together. "Did you hear any words that sound the same?"

More Ideas for how to use these books with your Kindergarteners to 2nd Graders.

- What does a policeman do to help the community? (*A policeman helps keep people safe, stops bad behavior, and helps people when they're in trouble.*)
- Discuss why rules important. What are some rules that help keep us safe at school or home? (*Don't run inside, look both ways before crossing the street, and always tell an adult if something is wrong.*)
- What does Sam mean when he says, "The more you give, the more you receive"? (*It means when we help others, it makes us feel good and others want to help us too.*)
- Discuss why it is important to be honest and respectful towards others: (*Being honest, kind, and respectful makes you a good role model. And it you can help make the world a better!*)

Discussion Topics, For Preschoolers

Discussion Topics:

Discussion Tip: Encourage open-ended responses and praise children for using their words to explain their thoughts. These questions help build empathy, emotional intelligence, and early social problem-solving skills.

Topics to Talk About

- **Community Helpers** – What does a policeman do to help us?
- **Safety and Rules** – Why are rules important?
- **Kindness and Helping Others** – How can we help people who need help?
- **Honesty and Good Choices** – What does it mean to tell the truth and do the right thing?
- **Feelings and Apologies** – How do we feel when we say “I’m sorry” and make things right?

1. Who is Sam? What is his job?

- *Sam is a policeman. His job is to keep people safe and help them when they need help.*

2. What did Sam do when a child got lost?

- *He looked for the child all day and found him! Sam made sure he was safe.*

3. What does Sam tell us about strangers?

- *He says not to talk to strangers, because they might not be safe people.*

4. Why does Sam help people who fight or argue?

- *He helps them stop fighting and tries to make things better.*

5. What does Sam say about doing good things?

- *When you do good things, you help others and feel proud inside!*

6. How can you be a helper like Sam?

- *I can help my friends, listen to my teacher, and follow the rules!*

7. What does Sam mean when he says “Let your light shine bright”?

- *It means be kind, good, and helpful so others can see your good heart!*

Discussion Topics, For Kindergarten to 2nd Grade

Discussion Topics:

Discussion Tips: These sample answers help guide students toward social-emotional learning goals while making connections to the story.

Community Helpers

- 1. What does a policeman do to help the community?** *A policeman helps keep people safe, stops bad behavior, and helps people when they're in trouble.*
- 2. Why do we need police officers in our neighborhoods?** *We need them to make sure everyone follows the rules and to help when someone needs protection or gets lost.*
- 3. How does Sam show that he cares about people?** *He protects a chicken from danger, helps a lost child, stops fights, and reminds people to do good things.*

Discussion about Safety and Responsibility

- 4. What does Sam say about talking to strangers? Why is that important?** *He says not to talk to strangers, because we don't know if they're safe. We should only talk to people we trust like parents, teachers, or police officers.*
- 5. What can you do if you ever get lost like the child in the story?** *Stay where you are, look for a police officer, or ask a store worker for help. Don't wander away or talk to just anyone.*
- 6. What are some rules that help keep us safe at school or home?** *Don't run inside, look both ways before crossing the street, and always tell an adult if something is wrong.*

Discussion about Kindness and Helping Others

- 7. What does Sam mean when he says, "The more you give, the more you receive"?** *It means when we help others, it makes us feel good. It also sets a good example and makes others want to help us too.*
- 8. How can we help others like Sam does?** *Open Discussion. Examples: We can share with others, help clean up, comfort a sad friend, or tell a teacher if someone needs help.*
- 9. Why do you think it's important to say "I'm sorry" after a fight or mistake?** *It helps fix hurt feelings and shows that we want to be kind again. Do you need a police officer to tell you to do that? Or can you do that on your own?*

Discussion Topics, For Kindergarten to 2nd Grade

Discussion about Honesty and Making Good Choices

10. What does Sam say about lying, cheating, or stealing? *He says it's wrong and against the law. We should always tell the truth and be honest.*

11. How do you feel when you tell the truth, even if it's hard? *I feel proud and brave because I did the right thing.*

12. What could happen if people didn't follow rules or tell the truth? *Things could become unsafe, people could get hurt, and it would be harder to trust one another.*

Discussion about Being a Role Model

13. What does it mean to "let your light shine bright"? *It means to do good things, be kind, and be a helper so others can see how to be good too.*

14. Who are some people you know who are good role models? *Police officers, firefighters, teachers, parents, friends, or even kids who help others.*

15. How can you be a role model at school or home? *By being kind, sharing, listening, telling the truth, and helping when someone needs it.*
